Philosophy lessons have started with real enthusiasm this term. Pictured are Frome and Wye Class taking part in sessions this week.



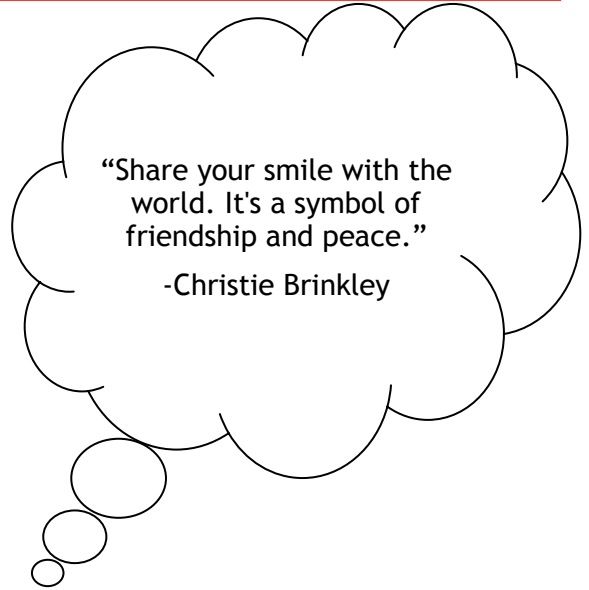

Lunch Time Supervisor Needed in School

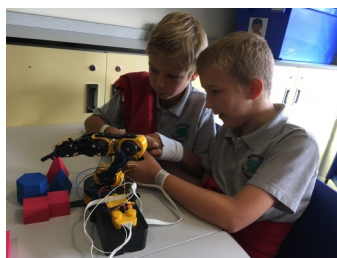
Would you like to assist in the lunch hall for an hour each day during term times. The role would consist of helping the children to cut up their food, socialising ,
