Less than half of the returned questionnaires had written feedback, this is a summary of general comments:

The school embraces its environment and has a wide, well balanced curriculum, some parents love how many events are put on for children, good to go out on trips, love that YR also go on trips. Parents very grateful for the input that children receive.

There is a warm family friendly atmosphere, children are very happy at Mordiford. Children are thriving. Parents like the 2 reports per year, but some feel there is a quite a lengthy gap between them. Some parents would like more information throughout the year and more information about what children are learning. Some find reports too brief and not informative. More information between Parent's Meetings so that there are no surprises. Others report that they are very happy with their child's progress at school.

More information for new parents about Class Worship, school activities etc. was suggested.

A few parents said that they would like more help in how they could help their child at home and more feedback in reading diaries and homework marking.

Some parents would like to have the opportunity to come into the classrooms more often, as it can feel unfriendly with our drop and go approach. Suggestions for specific times to see children's work rather than just the ability to view work electronically.

A few parents feel that too much pressure is put on in the build up to SATS.

Homework could be more differentiated, can occasionally be too hard, especially at end of KS2. Difficult to

manage because there is sometimes inconsistency between classes.

Poor selection of after school clubs, suggestion for more variety in clubs. Suggestion that there should be more PE.

Many parents felt that bullying is dealt with effectively, many others felt unable to make a comment on how the school deals with bullying as they had no personal experience, however one parent expressed concern over how an alleged bullying issue was dealt with.

Several parents expressed concern about the safety of children on the road at pick up and drop off

Site security is difficult and although there are locks on gates it is possible to walk through. Security at end of the day has improved.
