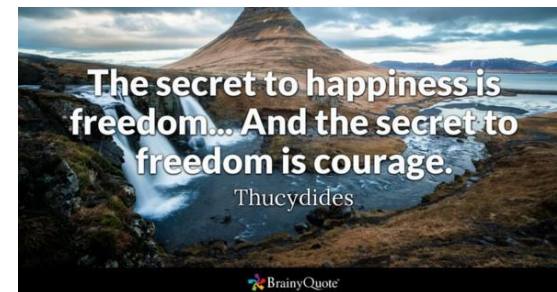
What the Bible teaches us about Freedom...
