Some Examples of the Impact of Pupil Premium spending 2017-2018
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We renewed Literacy Toolbox licences, and replenished Power of One and Two maths intervention materials • 1:1 and small group tuition led to good progress and PP pupils being secondary ready, good transitions to high school have been reported • Educational Psychologist and other support services were bought in: The assessments, feedback and programmes of support offered by these professional services and the reports produced have been a critical component in the wider aspects of provision, e.g. identification of need, training for staff, recommendations for classroom practice, meetings with parents and applications for additional funding or Statutory Assessment to support vulnerable pupils • Funding for trips, all children included in every trip/school activity regardless of any difference in financial circumstances. For example the PGL residential trip was a huge success for PP children who really pushed personal barriers • Families continue to use free Breakfast Club sessions, and free milk for all PP pupils: This has been a success as all children have the opportunity to receive the benefits of free breakfast and daily milk • The school's new PE kit was funded for PP children • Music lessons have been supported which has widened the experience for children including the most able disadvantaged pupils • Extra-curricular Spanish Lessons • Participation in Walk Tall programme to boost self-esteem • PP funding helped to support children attending the more able maths workshops at Lugwardine Academy and Science Fair visit to St Mary's High School, which again widened experiences and offered challenge to more able disadvantaged pupils
Outcomes for disadvantaged pupils 2018

- 100 % Y1 PP pupils achieved the expected level in the Phonic Screen
- 100% PP pupils are at the end of KS1 expected level for phonics
- All PP pupils in Y2 were at ARE in reading and maths an almost all in writing
- There were no PP pupils in end of KS2 data 2018
