The children were fascinated by the Royal Weekend Party exhibition, where they learned all about Daisy, The Countess of Warwick and how both the ladies and gentlemen of Victorian high society spent their evenings. The children liked the idea of having servants.

On return to the school the children were looking at the pictures of the castle and noticed a wizard in one of the windows and they felt sure that a princess was being kept in the castle by the wizard!

Some of the children have written letters to the wizard and yesterday the wizard wrote a letter back to the class. They have since been working on "spells" and feel sure that the Princess will be freed by the end of half term.
