Some Examples of the Impact of Pupil Premium spending 2018-2019
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 1:1 and small group tuition led to good progress and PP pupils being secondary ready, good transitions to high school have been reported • The funding of high interest/low ability reading material helped to promote a new found love of reading and to close significant gaps in reading and resulted in pupils achieving age related expectations • Educational Psychologist and other support services were bought in: The assessments, feedback and programmes of support offered by these professional services and the reports produced have been a critical component in the wider aspects of provision, e.g. identification of need, training for staff, recommendations for classroom practice, meetings with parents and applications for additional funding or Statutory Assessment to support vulnerable pupils • We renewed Literacy Toolbox licences, and replenished Power of One and Two maths intervention materials • Funding for trips, all children included in every trip/school activity regardless of any difference in financial circumstances. For example the PGL residential trip was a huge success for 3 PP children who really pushed personal barriers • Families continue to use free Breakfast Club sessions, and free milk for all PP pupils: This has been a success as all children have the opportunity to receive the benefits of free breakfast and daily milk and social time with their friends • Music lessons have been supported which has widened the experience for 2 children including the most able disadvantaged pupils • Extra-curricular Spanish Lessons, a new addition for this academic year, were enjoyed by 2 pupils • Participation in Walk Tall programme to boost self-esteem for 2 pupils • PP funding helped to support children attending the more able writers workshops at Lugwardine Academy and Science Fair visit to St Mary's High School, which again widened experiences and offered challenge to more able disadvantaged pupils, this benefitted the majority of PP cohort

Outcomes for disadvantaged pupils 2019

- 75 % Y1 PP pupils achieved the expected level in the Phonic Screen
- 100% PP pupils are at the end of KS1 expected level for phonics
- 100% PP pupils in Y2 were at ARE in reading, writing and maths
- 66% PP reached ARE in reading and maths
- PP pupils took on key roles of responsibility such as House Captains and Young Leaders
- PP cohort attendance for the year was 95%, compared to 97% non -pupil premium
