Pupil Premium Funding 2016-2017

In 2011-12 the Government launched its Pupil Premium funding. This money is delegated to schools based on the numbers of pupils in the school who are eligible for Free School Meals (FSM). From 2012-13, it has been expanded to include all children who have been eligible for FSM in any of the previous 6 years. This money is allocated to initiatives to ensure pupils reach their full potential, both academically and socially. Pupil Premium is also used for children looked after, children of armed services personnel and children adopted from care.

At Mordiford CE Primary School we have small numbers of pupils who are eligible for pupil premium. In the January 2016 census the figure was approx. 13% of the school roll.

The table below outlines our aim to support the children in our school who are eligible for Pupil Premium funding.

Focus for Pupil Premium spending 2016-2017
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Purchasing of booster material for literacy and numeracy, e.g. renew MY Maths and Literacy toolbox subscription £ 1000 • Purchase of 5x laptops for targeted support and to deliver intervention material £ 2,000 approx. • Investment in phonically decodable reading material to extend existing stock in Y1 £1000 • Purchase foreign language reading material £300 • Purchase of specialist equipment e.g. adapted pencils, chair supports, coloured overlays, coloured paper etc. £500 • Targeted 1:1 phonic support for 1 term in Y2 to close gaps £1,000 • Targeted additional 1:1 support in Y4 from teaching assistants £ 3,200 (x 36 weeks) • Structured small group tuition in Y4 from teaching assistants £2,720 (x 36 weeks) • Targeted additional 1:1 support in Y6 from teaching assistants £ 3,200 (x 36 weeks) • Structured small group tuition in Y6 from teaching assistants £2,720 (x 36 weeks) • Educational Psychologist and other support services £1000: • Provision for children attending trips including residential visits. £1000 • Inclusion in after-school clubs and peripatetic music sessions £500 • Free Breakfast Club sessions £800 (x39 weeks)

How will the impact of Pupil Premium Spending be monitored?
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Through rigorous and regular Pupil Progress Meetings the impact of interventions will be monitored to decide whether children entitled to Pupil Premium are making progress, in line with their non-pupil premium peers, in terms of academic progress, self-esteem, physical well-being and attendance • Involve whole staff in decisions about what next steps could be taken to narrow the gap for children receiving Pupil Premium • Records will be kept and monitored for intervention groups • Continue to monitor the specific impact of successful interventions/actions/resourcing • Meet regularly with the Pupil Premium Governor, Mrs Margaret Gerring, and update the Governing Body, half termly
