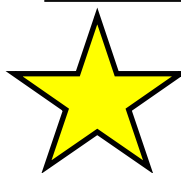
As a former pupil and now parent of the school, I see the opportunity to be governor as true privilege.

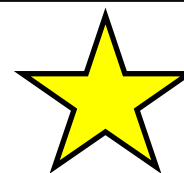
