Main Purpose of the Job:

- To support a neuro-diverse child
- To support the teacher & other children as directed

Main Duties and responsibilities:

Support for Children

- Develop a positive and supportive relationship with 1:1 child (and rest of class)
- Keep children safe, giving particular attention to 1:1 child's specific needs.
- Assist with the development and implementation of individual educational/behavioural plans and personal care programmes
- Supervise and provide particular support for children, including those with special needs, ensuring their safety and access to learning activities
- Set challenging expectations and promote self-esteem and independence
- Report back to teacher & SENDco about successes and challenges.

Support for the teacher:

- Have a sound knowledge/or experience of working with children
- Use strategies, in liaison with the class teacher, to support children to achieve their IEP/ end of year targets.
- Monitor children's responses to learning activities and accurately record achievement/progress as directed
- Establish constructive relationships with parents/carers
- Carry out observations of the children and assist with assessments where necessary.
- Support with individuals and groups in the class.
- Be flexible, patient and respond to need.
- Carry out small group or 1:1 SEN Interventions.
- Prepare, maintain and use equipment/resources required to meet lesson plans/relevant learning activity and assist children in their use.
- Assist in the display and presentation of learning cues and pupils work inside the classroom environment as required.

Other responsibilities

- Be reflective in your work and keen to undertake CPD and training as required.
- Appreciate and support the role of other professionals.
- Attend and participate in other meetings as required.
- Assist with the supervision of children outside of classroom time, including before and after school and at lunch time as required.
- Accompany teaching staff on visits, trips and out of school activities as required and take responsibility for a group under the supervision of the teacher.
- Be an excellent role model for children and colleagues in terms of behaviour and attitude.
- Demonstrate understanding of and commitment to the statutory requirements of legislation concerning Safeguarding, including child protection, equal opportunities, health and safety and inclusion
- Be punctual and professional at all times.
- Maintain confidentiality.
